





For lovers of the outdoors, it's a well-known tenet: Replace what you take, and leave the place better than how you found it. In criticism of industries that neglected this principle, environmentalist Barbara Ward said in 1972, "We have forgotten how to be good guests, how to walk lightly on the earth as its other creatures do."

Over the last several decades, the warnings of Ward and others, once thought to be alarmist or naïve, have taken hold in the consumer mainstream. From the coffee beans they brew to the cars they drive, market trends show that more consumers are looking for environmentally responsible, socially conscious alternatives. Quality and brand reputation are still important. But increasingly consumers also want to know where the products they buy come from and how they are made.

When it comes to purchasing lumber and wood products, consumer thinking tracks similarly. Due to growing awareness of the booming illegal logging trade and its disturbing impact on vital ecosystems and the fragile economies of developing countries, U.S. home buyers and homeowners are becoming justifiably more vigilant regarding the sources of the lumber and wood products used in their homes.



The simple definition of illegal logging

According to Chatham House, a British nonprofit group that analyzes business practices in third-world nations, illegal logging falls into the following categories: harvesting, processing and transporting timber or wood products without permission or proper licensing; cutting in protected areas or cutting protected species; and harvesting timber in excess of legal limits.

To compound matters further, the rip-and-run tactics of these illegal logging operations are



short-sighted – giving no thought to regenerating harvested areas and leaving large sections of land permanently scarred.

Recent accounts of illegal logging operations in areas such as Cambodia, Indonesia and New Guinea serve to spotlight the importance of being an environmentally and socially conscious consumer. According to the think tank Illegal-Logging.info, found online, "In the developing world, illegal logging damages forest ecosystems and cheats governments out of much-needed export revenue, as well as depriving local communities of opportunities to improve their quality of life. It promotes corruption, bankrolls regional conflict and discourages legal and sustainable forest practices. Illegal logging also reduces opportunities for forest industries in countries which have worked hard to ensure their operations are environmentally sustainable."

Growing numbers of consumers are looking for an easily verifiable way to discern between legally and illegally sourced wood products. In response, a select group of wood products manufacturers, including Virginia Vintage, who are committed to using only legal harvesting and reforestation practices have joined in support of the Hardwood Forestry Fund (hardwoodforestryfund.org). In recent years, we've made a coordinated effort to provide consumers with the facts they need to make informed and conscientious purchasing decisions. And, together, it looks like our efforts are making a real and noticeable difference.

Maintaining our forests

Through the practice of legal and responsible harvesting and reforestation, we've actually increased the number of America's forested acres to approximately 600 million in recent years. And, over that same period, we've increased per-acre productivity. As part of this continuing effort, Virginia Vintage has planted more than 750,000 trees in 18 states and four countries under the auspices of the Hardwood Forestry Fund.

Sure, responsible logging practices may not be a new idea. In 1907, President Theodore Roosevelt stated, "To waste, to destroy our natural resources, to skin and exhaust the land instead of using it so as to increase its usefulness, will result in undermining in the days of our children the very prosperity which we thought by right to hand down to them amplified and developed." But it's an idea that requires each generation to take notice, take responsibility and take action.

Thanks to the support of consumers like you and other forward-thinking industry professionals, Virginia Vintage and its friends at the Hardwood Forestry Fund are able to continue fighting to ensure the conservation, maintenance and legal harvesting of our forests.

You've decided on hardwood floors. Now it's time to do some homework and a little housework to protect your investment.

Installation

If you have any reservations about installing the floor yourself, we recommend professional installation. Figure on a rate of 300 square feet per day. Keep in mind that wood floors can be directly installed over most surfaces, except for carpet, but may require moisture barriers or underlayment. Only Anderson floors that are identified with this icon $\overleftarrow{\mathbb{M}}$ are suitable for installations over radiant heat systems. As with most hard surface flooring, before installing hardwood, your sub floor may need some repair or leveling.

Engineered Hardwood

Engineered products comprise several layers of wood, typically three to seven, that are glued together and topped with a finished veneer. The biggest advantage of engineered flooring is that it is easily installed over any subsurface, including cement, vinyl and existing wood. So now you can have hardwood floors where you never could before, like in basements. Anderson offers many beautiful engineered wood products from which to choose.

Apply a Little TLC

After your floor is installed, you'll need to care for it. Doing so isn't difficult or time consuming, but there are things you need to keep in mind.

Factors influencing wear include location, traffic patterns and children and/or pets, all of which have direct impact on how often a floor needs to be cleaned. The floor should be swept or vacuumed as needed, and spills wiped up as they occur. Use only a cleaner recommended by your retailer. It works best with the finish, leaves behind no residue and protects both the floor and the warranty. Wood floors are not indestructible. Water, spills, dirt and other abrasive substances can damage the finish, in spite of today's technology.

Pivot points or high-traffic areas are subjected to more than normal wear and tear, and small rugs can be placed in these areas to add protection. Also consider rugs in areas of your kitchen where high traffic is inevitable, like in front of the sink or stove. To protect the floors in dining areas, simply apply the proper felt pads or glides to the bottom of the chair legs. Hardwood floors in foyers or areas with exterior doors also need extra protection.



Placing walk-off mats just outside helps prevent dirt and debris from being brought in. Just inside these entry points, place small rugs to provide protection and add beauty. When choosing an area rug to be placed directly over the wood, make sure the backing allows the floor to breathe, especially for a floor that's glued directly over a concrete slab. Lastly, make sure to vacuum or shake off area rugs and walk-off mats frequently.

Wood is a natural product that expands and contracts at different times during the year, and maintaining

proper humidity levels year-round helps minimize the effects of too much or too little airborne moisture. Controlling humidity, especially during the heating season, helps minimize gaps in between boards. Take notice of the manufacturer's recommended humidity level. You can buy a thermal hygrometer from any hardware store.

Handcrafted floors have become increasingly popular as consumers flock to this "character" look. Hand-scraped, hand-sanded, hand-sculpted or hand-distressed flooring provides a one-of-akind appearance wherever it's used. Fortunately, maintenance and precautionary measures are the same for these handcrafted floors as any other hardwood flooring.

Never wet-mop, damp-mop or flood your floor with water, as this can severely damage the flooring and will void the warranties. Do not use oil soaps, liquid or paste wax products or other household cleaners that contain lemon oil, tung oil, silicon or ammonia. These and other similar products will harm the long-term Performance Edge[™] of your floor and may also affect its recoatability.

By observing a few precautions and setting up a regular cleaning routine and maintenance program, you can expect years of beauty from your floor. Sweep or use a brush or felt head vacuum regularly, since built-up grit can damage the surface of the wood. Be certain the wheels of the vacuum are clean and do not damage the finish. Remove spills promptly using a soft cloth and recommended cleaning products. Any wood floor will show signs of wear over time, but these simple tips will dramatically extend the life of your floor.

If a board or small section of your floor is damaged, it can be repaired or replaced without replacing the entire surface. Your dealer or installer can help you do the repair.

Added Protection

1. Keep pets' nails trimmed and paws clean.

2. Place protective pads under furniture legs/feet.

3. Use a dolly and protective sheets of plywood when moving heavy objects, furniture or appliances.

- 4. Make certain furniture casters are clean and operate properly.
- 5. Remove shoes with spiked or damaged heels before walking on hardwood floors.
- 6. Exposure to the sun and it's UV rays accelerates the oxidation and aging of wood and fabrics. This causes the color to fade or change. Rearrange rugs and furniture periodically so the floor ages evenly. Keeping blinds closed while rooms are unoccupied helps minimize the effects of prolonged exposure to sunlight.
